November was a busy busy month at Paws and Claws. We had many events, from Reading to Cats, Girl Scout tours, a volunteer open house, basement organization day and more!

Best of all, we saved our highest number of cats in one month, crossing into triple digit territory! 106 new cats joined the Paws and Claws family in November.

#### **Rescue Statistics**

We took in **106** new cats in the month of November **(63 kittens**, 43 cats). We achieved a 100% live save rate in November, maintaining our overall save rate of 98%.

We performed 52 on-site surgeries in November. 25 were spays and 27 were neuters. Our surgical department has significantly increased efficiency since its inception in March of 2024.

## Mama Tuna's Transformation: Healing Her Skin After Motherhood

Tuna, a devoted mama cat, had nurtured her kittens until they were strong and independent, but the toll it took on her body was clear. Though her kittens no longer nursed, the skin on her stomach remained sensitive and inflamed. She'd lick herself endlessly, trying to soothe her skin, but it only made things worse.

For the past month and a half, Tuna has been living in a peaceful foster home, where every effort has been made to reduce her stress. Tuna was started on a new medication to help her skin, and the results have been amazing.

With her inflammation under control, Tuna has blossomed into a happy, confident cat. She's become a little chatterbox, greeting her foster family with soft meows and always eager to be near them. Tuna's journey proves how a little love and the right treatment can turn a difficult situation around.




The fur on Tuna's stomach has started to grow back and she's been feeling much better in her foster home.

### **Adoption Statistics**


During the month of November, we had 167 cats live at the Adoption Center.

76 cats were adopted this month, which is up 43% over last November. That's 65 forever homes!



We've saved a total of 768 cats in 2024 so far. We're 93% towards our goal of saving 829 cats this year.

This month, we welcomed 8 new members to the Paw Print Club, bringing our total number of dedicated donors to 235. Thanks to their consistent generosity, we've been able to ensure that every cat in our care receives the love and attention they need to thrive.

medical supplies, and foster essentials. With everything neat, our volunteers can work more efficiently, quickly finding what they need and getting back upstairs to care for our cats.




